

Welcome to the 2013 Morton Reisman Eighth Grade Operetta JOSEPH AND THE AMAZING TECHNICOLOR® DREAMCOAT. Joseph's history starts back in 1967 when Andrew Lloyd Webber was asked by Alan Doggett, head of the Music Department at Colet court, St. Paul's Junior School, to write a "pop cantata" for the school choir. Andrew Lloyd Webber asked Tim Rice to write lyrics and they created a 20-minute piece based on the story of Joseph. Over the years this piece went through many changes and in the mid to late 70's, the show was presented in its present form at the Haymarket Theatre, Leicester. It was also a huge success in America at that time. Many schools were producing amateur productions of the musical and JOSEPH AND THE AMAZING TECHNICOLOR® DREAMCOAT made it to the Royale Theatre on Broadway January 27, 1982. The film version was released in 1999 starring Donny Osmond as Joseph. and there was a revival in 2007 at the Adelphi Theatre, London. Today, with many productions in schools and theatres, it continues to delight audiences around the world.

We all have dreams and aspirations. There will always be obstacles, but we persevere and find a way to get through the rough times. JOSEPH AND THE AMAZING TECHNICOLOR® DREAMCOAT takes us on a musical journey through the life of a family torn apart by jealousy. Some may think of this musical as a light romp because of the simplicity of having a narrator tell the story, the many different styles of music throughout the piece (such as country, calypso, and pop), the fact that everything is sung, and because some songs use humor to make light of difficult situations. This is certainly no romp. The humor works well to point out just how foolish jealousy and hatred really are. The narrator represents the present, while the characters bring to life the past, and the two constantly intertwine to show us how the past affects the future. Joseph's insights,

strong faith, and willingness to forgive his brothers help us understand how to move through difficult times and build a bridge that leads us to a better future. This musical is a rich and challenging work. This eighth-grade class was most certainly up for the challenges. Their enthusiasm and initiative have made the team a delight to work with. They're involved in every aspect of the show from performing, choreographing and student directing to technical operations such as running lights, sound, mics, helping with costumes, make-up, set design, producing the poster, programs and lobby displays. They have made this show their own! Every single ensemble member matters greatly as an individual and when the group comes together, uniting all talents to tell this inspiring story, that is when the magic happens. Like Joseph's dreams and aspirations the power of the ensemble is unstoppable.

BZAEDS on Broadway takes the students on a wonderful journey, first exploring and then developing their performing arts skills, while at the same time learning what it means to work as an ensemble. Every year I see how the students, faculty, staff, relatives and parents come together to create an experience of a lifetime for BZAEDS eighth-graders.It's because of these contributions that we're able not only to mount this marvelous production. but also to include the traditional elements that make it so special, including the performances of the siblings, the Operetta Instrumental Ensemble (OIE) and this year's song translated into Hebrew, "Any Dream Will Do." Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat Synopsis

Act 1

Just like in the book of Genesis, JOSEPH AND THE AMAZING TECHNICOLOR® DREAMCOAT is about a family of twelve brothers who live in Canaan. Joseph is his fathers's favorite son, which makes the other brothers very jealous. One afternoon, after Joseph finishes telling his brothers about his dreams of rising above all of them, the brothers plan a scheme to kill Joseph. They throw Joseph in a pit with the intention of leaving him there to die, but then some Ishmaelites come by. The Ishmaelites bring Joseph to Egypt and sell him as a slave to a slave owner named Potiphar. While Joseph is hard at work Ms. Potiphar, Potiphar's wife, comes by and distracts Joseph. The slave owner sees this action and throws Joseph in jail. In jail, Joseph meets a baker and a butler who both had dreams they didn't understand. Joseph interprets these dreams and comes to a conclusion the butler will be free, but the baker will not.

Act 2

While Joseph is in jail the Pharaoh of Egypt has a dream that needs to be interpreted. A servant of Pharaohs, who had heard about the butler and baker's dreams that were interpreted correctly, tells Pharaoh he knows a guy who could interpret dreams, Joseph. Joseph is brought to Pharaoh and interprets his dream: there will be seven good years with lots of food and then seven bad years of famine. Meanwhile, the brothers are in Canaan and don't have any

food to eat. Knowing about Egypt's seven years of plenty of crops, they head to Egypt to find something to eat. Because there is a famine in Egypt, the brothers end up begging for food from Joseph, but the brothers don't recognize Joseph. Joseph pretends he doesn't know his brothers and gives them food to eat, but then as they are leaving, plants a stolen golden cup in Benjamin's sack to get back at them for trying to kill him. When they are leaving Joseph and guards chase after them and find the cup in Benjamin's sack. The brothers beg for him not to throw Benjamin in jail, that he must have been framed, and Joseph realizes his brothers have changed and are good men now. He shows them that he is Joseph and they are all happily reunited.






