About This Bernard Zell Production

This Bernard Zell production of Getting to Know...The Sound of Music is the finale of the Middle School Performing Arts curriculum. Students build the foundations of theatre in fifth and sixth grades, then work together as a grade to design and perform a one act play in seventh grade and a full-length musical in eighth grade, The Morton Reisman Eighth Grade Operetta. The show changes from year to year, but the focus remains the same.

The experience allows for the development of self-confidence and provides an avenue to further strengthen the group identity. Additionally, the Performing Arts curriculum helps students strengthen and hone their collaborative skills. Another important goal is developing empathy, as students act as different characters and literally have to step into someone else's shoes to gain new perspectives. At Bernard Zell, we believe that this ongoing exploration of visual, musical, and performing arts is an important part of the curriculum, playing a vital role in developing the intellectual, spiritual and personal potential of every student.

Show Synopsis

The final collaboration between Rodgers & Hammerstein was destined to become the world's most beloved musical. When a postulant proves too high-spirited for the religious life, she is dispatched to serve as governess for the seven children of a widowed naval Captain. Her growing rapport with the youngsters, coupled with her generosity of spirit, gradually captures the heart of the stern Captain, and they marry. Upon returning from their honeymoon they discover that Austria has been invaded by the Nazis, who demand the Captain's immediate service in their navy. The family's narrow escape over the mountains to Switzerland on the eve of World War II provides one of the most thrilling and inspirational finales ever presented in the theatre. The motion picture version remains the most popular movie musical of all time. In this adaptation for pre-high school students, the content has been edited to better suit younger attention spans, but all the elements that make this show a classic are still in place.

Director's Note

Welcome to Bernard Zell Anshe Emet Day School's 2019 Morton Reisman Operetta, Getting to Know...The Sound of Music. The musical is adapted from the full-length 1959 Broadway production, directed by Vincent J. Donehue with music and lyrics by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II and a book by Howard Lindsay and Russell Crouse. This version is a 75-minute production which was specifically adapted by R&H (Rodgers and Hammerstein) to be more supportive of middle-school aged performers.

The Sound of Music, besides being one of the most loved and well-known movie musicals, is a powerful story made all the more poignant since it is based on a true story: Maria Augusta Trapp's 1949 memoir The Trapp Family Singers. Ultimately, the story is about the power of music on the human spirit and the power of the human spirit to resist fascism, or at least to resist joining fascism.

As a theatre educator, I see the positive effects that Bernard Zell's Performing Arts Program, and especially the Operetta, has on students. A musical is a purely collaborative effort in which everyone is focused on telling one story. Students use advanced problemsolving skills, communication, memorization skills, risk-taking and personal connections to create the best product they can. Oftentimes, students surprise themselves by rising to their full potential.

This experience is unique as students are given chances to shine not only onstage, but also in their backstage roles. This is the second year of a program that creates a distribution of responsibility wherein there are student heads of each department. For example, the student stage managers report to the head student stage manager, who reports to the director. This program has created leadership opportunities that students have welcomed with passion and seriousness. It has also helped to create peer-to-peer accountability and ultimately increased student buy-in to the experience. I have been particularly impressed with this group's leadership and collaboration.

Ultimately, the purpose of the Operetta is to create a unique project during which the students truly collaborate toward a common goal that will be rewarding, enriching and challenging. The students have been hard at work learning choreography, music, blocking and taking responsibility for their crew roles. I am excited for them to share their work with you.
